<u>Playground upgrades:</u> To replace the 16 swings, seats and chains while keeping the current frame is \$2,833. <u>Voted and approved.</u> Mr. Dunn said maintenance could install them, if not it would be an additional \$2.300 for installation. The broken piece of equipment with the wheels is no longer manufactured, so? <u>Two Basketball goals</u> for the playground requested by Coach Rutherford and Coach Stricklin are \$799 each, for two plus taxes are about \$1,750.00. <u>Voted and approved</u>.

Added a request for two soccer goals 5x8 and balls. Coach Stricklin to get us prices. Voted and approved up to \$150 for each goal, plus all three size balls. Coaches will pick up items and deliver to school.

4. NEW IDEAS OR SCHOOL NEEDS -

<u>Signs:</u> are ordered for playground fences to keep gates closed. Delivery says the 15th-27th Signs requested for the Sports Entrance, poster boards are looking bad,

<u>Tree Replacement:</u> Tausha spoke to a CO parent that owns Fox Cuts Lawn and Landscape. He said he would remove the old tree and replace it for \$300. Does that sound good? voted and approved.

<u>Handicapped upgrades to Playground:</u> We are <u>waiting</u> to see if Wilson County Schools is going to fund this.

<u>Mulch for the Playground</u>: We are *waiting* to see if Wilson County Schools is going to fund this.

<u>Tables under playground canopy</u> - We had a teacher request for the table to be attached to the concrete slab, she said students have almost flipped them when playing on them. The scouts made these tables for CO. Mr. Dunn said it is fine for these to be affixed to concrete slab, can see if scouts will do it - does not need to go through school - if not scouts - who? Price blue picnic tables to replace those with.

School Cleanup Day - Do we still need to have one? Mr. Dunn said yes much needed - walls needs washed and some trim painted - attendees mentioned fall may be good - Dunn said weekends would be great - I suggested a "picnic/play - clean up Day" to hopefully maybe bring in more - said we need at least 25 volunteers or more to make it count and that is why we canceled last spring - everyone said that would be a good way to bring people in, on a saturday from 9-12.

Garden Boxes on Playground- Clean up and get rid of dangerous rebar, maybe rent a dumpster.
